Annual Giving Fund: D-7710 FIRST TO EXCEED ITS APF GOAL. D-7770 has no Zero Giving Clubs. In the words of AGF Chair D-7610 Scott Mills – “we ain’t done yet!” D-7670 will speed up when the PolioPlus Prius is awarded this weekend at its Rocking District Conference. D-7770 is showing more pink this month. Above PolioPlus data does not reflect District Designated Fund (DDF) allocations, amounting to approximately \$167,537 for 2009-2010; \$50,000 was allocated by D-7770 alone. Total Zone 33 \$200M Challenge DDF contributions equal \$556,189 since DEC 1, 2007.

Did You know?

- ✚ Effective January 1, 2011, there will be 3 levels within the Arch C. Klump Society. Each level will have its own distinctive pin.
- ✚ Bequest Society levels will be revised to be consistent with Arch C. Klump Society and Major Donor levels.
- ✚ Rotary Peace Centers Major Gifts initiative has reached approximately \$45.8M. Goal is \$95M by 2015.
- ✚ Effective July 1, 2010, the minimum amount to initiate a Donor Advised Fund (DAF) will be \$10K, not \$20K.
- ✚ The highest rate of Humanitarian Grant world reporting compliance was recently reached since the semi-annual report analysis was initiated.
- ✚ Future Vision Plan individual beneficiaries of Global Grants will have the status Rotary Foundation alumni. Same may be true of District Grant individuals after proper consideration.

Rotarians have had a lot of questions about the information presented in this article.

Robert Scott, Chair of Rotary's International Polio Plus Committee, responded to the April 23 article the following letter:

Dear Editor,

Your April 23 article documents the myriad complexities inherent in the effort to eradicate polio.

Yet, despite challenges both ongoing and emerging, tremendous progress continues to be made. The incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99 percent since 1988, when Rotary International partnered with the WHO, the CDC and UNICEF to launch the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.

We are especially heartened by the recent progress in Nigeria, arguably the most challenging of the four remaining polio-endemic countries. Increased efforts to reach all of Nigeria's children under age 5 with the oral polio vaccine are paying off, with only two cases recorded so far this year, compared with 193 cases this time last year.

The current outbreak in Tajikistan dramatically underscores the necessity of staying the course until the crippling disease is vanquished permanently. It shows how quickly polio can rebound and reclaim territory, and why "99 percent" is not good enough.

Rotary and its partners have been at this for more than 20 years, achieving successes that demonstrate the feasibility of polio eradication. The partners' commitment and tenacity were recognized in 2007, when the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation stepped in to provide major crucial funding.

Finally, the program has shown that attacking one disease is very far from being a vertical program with the development of trained epidemiologists, the founding of 143 laboratories around the world doing much more than polio work and a surveillance system than can and is used for all communicable diseases.
