The Rotary Club of Buckhannon decided to put a different "spin" on their fundraising efforts by sponsoring a celebrity basketball game with the "Harlem Legends" in mid November. The Legends team members are former Harlem Globetrotters, NBA, and Olympic players dazzling crowds with their family-oriented basketball game, and lots of audience participation.

The opponents "The Upshur All Stars" team included the City Police Chief, Fire Chief, Rotary Club of Buckhannon President, members of city council, local business owners, and football coaches from WV Wesleyan College. In addition, the local Upshur County Special Olympics gold-medal winning team played for a portion of the game against the Legends and received a standing ovation for their efforts!



Rotarians sold tickets, manned the concession stand – most of which were donated by local merchants, and corporate sponsors received court-side seats and event publicity. The media response was overwhelming with both NBC and CBS affiliate stations, radio stations, and area newspapers interviewing the Legends prior to the game for added promotion. All attended the sold-out game, and the post-publicity was unbelievable.

In addition to the fun and good will in the community, this event netted approximately \$6,000 --- all to be contributed to the club's Polio Plus program!

Launched in 2002, the Rotary Centers for International Studies program are already showing results. Currently, at least 400 Rotary World Peace Fellow alumni are making a difference in jobs within United Nations agencies, the World Bank, and leading non-governmental organizations.

The 2011 applications were made available for download from the Rotary website beginning January 2010. Applications are due to The Rotary Foundation by 1 July of every year. Through a worldwide, competitive process, this program awards full scholarships to up to 100 Rotary World Peace Fellows each year. Members of the 2010-11 class will be announced in October.
